Dr. Gadi is Professor and Director of Medical Oncology at the University of Illinois Chicago and the Deputy Director of the University of Illinois Cancer Center. Prior to his arrival in Chicago, He trained at (2000-2006) and later joined the faculty (2006-2020) of the University of Washington and Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center. Dr. Gadi's laboratory focuses on immunology and cancer, including many findings that have been commercialized for routine patient benefit. In addition to his administrative duties and laboratory research, Dr. Gadi is a practicing medical oncologist focused on care for patients with breast cancer and sarcoma. As a clinical investigator, he has led both industry sponsored and investigator-initiated clinical trials in breast and other cancers evaluating novel small molecules to biologics to cellular therapies. He has collectively published and presented hundreds of plenary sessions, abstracts, and manuscripts. He is passionate about education of all range of learners from high school to medical students, from residents to fellows, and to established academic and community providers here in Chicago but also around the country and world.

Dr. Abiola Falilat Ibraheem is an Assistant Professor in the Division of Hematology/Oncology at the University of Illinois. She has a medical degree from Olabisi Onabanjo University, Nigeria, and an ongoing Master's in Global Health at Northwestern University. Dr. Ibraheem's postgraduate training encompasses a Hematology Oncology fellowship at the University of Chicago and an Internal Medicine residency at Morehouse School of Medicine.

Her career began in Nigeria as a Medical Officer, followed by academic appointments at the University of Chicago and the University of Illinois. Dr. Ibraheem is board-certified in Hematology, Medical Oncology, and Internal Medicine, with licenses in Illinois and Georgia.

She is involved in several professional societies, including the Translational Breast Cancer Research Consortium. Dr. Ibraheem has received multiple honors, including the Illinois Fellows Award and ASCO Merit Awards. Her research, focusing on breast cancer and clinical trials in Africa, includes numerous peer-reviewed publications. Dr. Ibraheem's work emphasizes oncology research, global health, and improving cancer care, highlighted by her involvement in various professional development courses and speaking engagements.

### KENT HOSKINS, MD

Eileen Lindsey Heidrick Professor in Oncology and Professor of Medicine

Dr. Kent F. Hoskins is an oncologist at the University of Illinois Chicago, where he serves as the Eileen Lindsay Heidrick Professor in Oncology and Professor of Medicine and the Associate Chief of the Division of Hematology/Oncology. He received his post-doctoral laboratory training in breast cancer genetics and cancer molecular genetics at the University of Michigan and the University of Pennsylvania.

Dr. Hoskins' career includes roles at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine, Rockford Health Systems, and OSF Saint Anthony Center for Cancer Care. He holds a medical degree from the University of Iowa College of Medicine and completed his residency and fellowship there. Dr. Hoskins has held leadership positions in various medical and research committees, significantly impacting cancer research and policy. Board-certified in General Internal Medicine and Medical Oncology, he is an active member of notable professional societies. He has an extensive portfolio of peer-reviewed publications on breast cancer research and genetics. His dedication to teaching is evident through his involvement in mentoring across academic levels.



### JOCELYN RAY, MD, PHD

Assistant Professor in Gynecologic Oncology

University of Illinois Cancer Center

Dr. Jocelyn Ray is an Assistant Professor in Gynecologic Oncology at the University of Illinois, Chicago. She earned her Ph.D. in Reproductive Physiology from the University of Toronto and an M.D. from the University of Central Florida College of Medicine. Dr. Ray completed her residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology at Stanford Hospital and a fellowship in Gynecologic Oncology at Fox Chase/Temple University Hospital.

Her career is marked by significant achievements, including the Society of Gynecologic Oncology Outstanding Resident Award and the National Institute of Health Loan Repayment Plan award. Dr. Ray has contributed to research in gynecologic oncology with several peer-reviewed publications and leading research projects on topics like endometrial cancer and ovarian cancer localization.

In addition to her research and clinical work, she is actively involved in education, serving as a clinical educator, lecturer, and Resident Robotics course instructor. Dr. Ray's commitment extends to community service, with leadership roles in student and medical organizations and a track record of mentoring and volunteering.
